ACCIDENT INVESTIGATION TIPS

Topic Overview

The purpose of conducting an accident investigation is to find out what happened so that we can take steps to prevent similar incidents in the future.

Properly Conducted Investigations

Properly conducted investigations must be thorough and can help us learn from our mistakes. They can help us learn from our mistakes. Unfortunately, accident investigations can fail because employees "go through the motions" while completing the investigation.

The most important point to remember while conducting an accident investigation is that: Accidents are caused. The focus of an investigation should be to determine ROOT CAUSES. Once these root causes have been identified, actions should be taken to:

- 1. Eliminate the hazard (eliminate process, substitute materials...), or
- 2. Isolate the hazard (guards, procedures...), or
- 3. Protect the worker through additional PPE (glasses, gloves...)

Accident investigations are FACT-FINDING FUNCTIONS, NOT FAULT-FINDING MISSIONS!

Workers should feel willing to talk freely with investigators, because they can be assured that disciplinary action will not be initiated if the accident was unintentional.

Remember, conducting accident investigations can be one of the most useful tools in preventing future accidents, so ensure that they are given the time that they deserve.
